URGENT CALL FOR WIND ENERGY

LIPA will soon decide on proposals to satisfy the growing energy needs of the East End of Long Island. LIPA has the authority to choose dirty, fossil fuel power technologies or clean energy such as wind, solar, battery storage and more.

Governor Cuomo plays a big role in LIPA's decision as he directs the overall energy policy for NYS and appoints the majority of LIPA trustees. If LIPA chooses fossil fuel instead of clean energy, East Enders will be stuck with polluting and expensive fossil fuel generators for decades.
