As your constituent, I strongly OPPOSE all four proposed rules within the 2025 Proposed Rules to Revise Endangered Species Act Regulations, including the following docket numbers:

FWS-HQ-ES-2025-0039 (Section 4) FWS-HQ-ES-2025-0044 (Section 7) FWS-HQ-ES-2025-0029 (Section 4(d)) FWS-HQ-ES-2025-0048 (Section 4(b)(2))

I am opposing because the ESA has been effective and popular for over 50 years. Over decades of polling, the ESA has consistent bipartisan support with 84% of Americans in support of it. More than 99% of all species listed on the ESA have been saved from extinction or are recovering. Why are we trying to change a good thing? Not only has it been successful in saving species, but it has had enormous benefits to the public. Decision makers cannot overlook how coastal wetlands have allowed our children to swim in unpolluted lakes, or protected us from the worst of flash floods.
